InitialLit Phonics Programme

We need more books in the Library by Ryan Z. Yr6

YEAR 6 CAMP 2019

During Week 1, we took 55 Year 6 students to Woodhouse Activity Centre for Year 6 Camp. It was an action-packed three days filled with exciting activities, many laughs and happy memories that ultimately has brought our group of students closer together.



We hit the floor running as we hadn’t even moved into our dorms yet before we were split into two groups and straight into our first activities. One group tackled the famous Challenge Hill where the students (and teachers) physical abilities were put to the test completing a number of obstacle courses. The other group had their abilities to work together to overcome problems challenged by participating in a number of tricky team-building exercises. The third and final activity of our first day was a photo hunt around the 54-hectare property.

We finished the day with a fantastic meal and Mrs. Buckley’s ‘Minute to Win It’ challenges that turned friends into short-lived enemies as they battled each other to be titled the champion dorm. Then it was time for an early night (even though some



students didn’t quite manage to do so).

The second day was the most exciting but also the most physically demanding. The activities completed included Ice-Blocking (which is as fun as it sounds), Laser Skirmish, rock climbing and the crowd favourite, Tube Sliding. The Tube Slide had a few of the students nervous as it was very steep and on a very high hill but each and every one of the students (and their teachers) overcame their fears to give it a try go at least once. It was my personal highlight of the camp to see students face their fears and give things a go. In the end, it was harder to get them to stop because they were having so much fun. Mr Springer was able to let out his inner-child as he raced up and down the hill over and over again to fit in as many goes as possible.



That night, after the sun had set, those students with any energy left went on a night walk to try and discover any of the wildlife that live in the area. There were no shortage

of koalas and possums spotted and I hear even the odd owl. Luckily, Mr. Springer and Mrs. Buckley knew exactly where they were at all times and in no way, shape or form got lost (please note the sarcasm). The rest of the students enjoyed a more relaxing time with some popcorn and a movie. Unsurprisingly, it was much easier to get all students to sleep that night.

Our last morning started with a quick re-packing of our bags and clean-up of the dorms and then it was straight into our last two activities that included the Labyrinth and completing some of the obstacles that we didn’t get to on Challenge Hill. We were soon back on the bus and on our way back to school.

A big thank you to Anthony and Karen who came up to offer their support for a day too. The camp would not have happened if not for you all.
